Notes on Council 2018

The Episcopal Diocese of Southern Virginia held its annual Council on Feb. 15-17. The first Annual Council of this diocese was held 125 years ago; hence, and quite appropriately, this one was held in the history-laden and tradition - honoring town of Williamsburg. Representing approximately 100 parishes, there were nearly 1000 people attending the event in the Williamsburg Lodge. (Epiphany was represented by the Rev. Richard O. Bridgford, the Rev. Julia Ashby, Jackie Rochelle, Mary Shaffer, Robert Everett, and Joyce Williams.) In addition to the perfunctory administrative matters at hand, the Council offered many opportunities for spiritual consideration, understanding, and growth.

Most administration matters were dispensed with rather quickly. There were also several presentations highlighting the many ministries of this diocese; i.e., Episcopal Youth, Latino Ministries, College Ministries, Addictions and Recovery Commission, Community Action Network, etc.

After the morning worship on the first day, Bishop Hollerith gave his remarks. To summarize a few, he said that his wish for the diocese was to be healthy, and he asked all to look and see what it is that we are offering to the world around us. And quite surprisingly to many of us, he announced his retirement to become effective on Dec.31, 2018. He concluded his remarks by saying, "But what I do have is faith – faith in the rightness of the journey and faith in the one who always strengthens us to take it. And, finally, I have faith in you – the people of the Episcopal Church in Southern Virginia. I know what you can accomplish and I know the goodness and greatness of your hearts."

Lenten Program


Each Thursday we will share a pot luck dinner beginning at 6 PM which will be followed by a forty-five minute program at 6:30.

March 1 - "How Bishops are Elected" and "Before and After Female Clergy" by Richard and Julia.

March 8 - "Fireside Chat" with Richard and Julia. This will be an opportunity to ask any questions you might have about the Bible, theology, history, ethics, the church, being a priest, etc. It is your chance to "stump the priest."

Bring your flowers for the "Flowering of the Cross" and items for the reception after the 11:00 service.
